

THRILLER WELL ACTED

One rule always is valid in plays designed as thrillers, the more improbable the main situation the more natural must be the accompanying circumstances. In "Love From a Stranger," author Frank Vosper has been at great pains to establish this preliminary naturalism, and the play succeeds admirably.

The core of the story is the experience of a woman who finds that her husband is a homicidal maniac, with a special taste for slaughtering his successive wives.

These two characters were played by Noel Chandler and Peter Buchanan in Brisbane Repertory Theatre Society's production of the piece in the Princess Theatre last night. Miss Chandler's work in the last act was excellent. Mr. Buchanan was equally good. Clare Clarke and W. Binning Wilson also worked well.

"Love From a Stranger" will be repeated to-night. Proceeds from both performances will be given to the fund of Air Force House, Bowen Hills.—
